Let's Talk Lotto Dinner

Most all of you know what the Lotto Dinner is. We have some new folks that might not know what the lotto dinner. We have been playing our brand of lotto since former Chapter Directors Don & Judi Black came up with it. The rules for playing are simple. We use a Crown Royal bag to hold the 10 white poker chips and 1 red poker chip. The white chips have a number from 1 to 10. These numbers correspond to 10 local restaurants. To begin the game one ticket is issued to everyone eligible to play. They put their name on the ticket and turn it in with \$1.00. All of this takes place usually before everyone orders dinner. At a time when a waiter or waitress is not busy, I will have the camera person take a picture of the waitperson pulling a ticket, which I conceal inside an envelope. After finishing dinner, I will announce the name on the ticket pulled by the waitstaff. At this time, the person whose name was pull, will have the opportunity to pull a chip from the Crown Rayal bag. This is where the red chip comes in. If a white ticket is pulled, the number on the chip will be the restaurant we go to the next month. Everyone wants the chance to pull the red chip because the red chip is the winner of the Lotto Dinner pot.

Now a couple of rudimentary rules on eligibility to play Lotto. When the pot is empty, anyone in the chapter with current EWMA Membership is eligible to play. Once the pot gets up to over \$50.00 a member who has not played before must attend 3 months of lotto play dinners before becoming eligible to play. Once the pot goes over \$250.00 one white chip will be removed from the game. After \$300.00 another white chip will be removed from the game and so on after each \$50.00 increment.

Florida District Safety/Ride Coordinators Safety Article

TIME=DISTANCE

Greetings to all!

You can't change the laws of physics. It takes a certain amount of distance to stop your motorcycle in an emergency. The size of the motorcycle doesn't really change the stopping distance because the manufactures take stopping distance into account when they are determining the size of the bikes brakes and tires. The heaver the motorcycle the larger the brake rotors, brake pads, and tires will be. Therefore all motorcycles regardless of size should stop in about the same distance at any given speed.

One thing that adds to stopping distance is reaction time. If you delay in identifying a problem you will delay in applying the brakes. Therefore you will travel further than you should have in an emergency stop. This can mean the difference between hitting the car that just turned left in front of you or not.

I will give you an example of this with a motorcycle that is traveling 45mph which is a common speed. If the motorcyclist does not delay his/her reaction time, a motorcycle should stop in 90 feet at 45mph. If the rider delays in applying the brakes by one second the stopping distance increases to 156 feet. If the rider delays in applying the brakes by two seconds the braking distance increases to 222 feet. I think you get the idea. That can mean the difference between being able to stop before you broadside the car that just turned left in front of you, or hitting it. If you skid one or both tires during the stop you are also adding more distance to your stop. That is why an ABS Braking System is such a great thing to have. It stops the tires from skidding, but the ABS System can't help you is you delayed in applying the brakes.

The time to be at you best alert status in when you are going through an intersection. An intersection is where motorcycles and cars crash together the most. Setting up a good lane position can also be very helpful to prevent a crash. Position your motorcycle in your lane to where the approaching left turn vehicle driver can see you best and early enough to hopefully stop them from making the turn in front of you. Watch the turning wheels of the approaching vehicle rather than making eye contact with the driver. You might think the driver is looking at you, but he/she might just be looking through you. The wheels are either turning or not. Watching the wheels is a much better identifying clue to follow. Always be prepared to swerve if the car does make the turn. Have more than one escape path predetermined in your mind should the car turn. Your escape path options are fluid based on the circumstances at that exact moment. You might escape hitting the car by swerving behind the vehicle or even possibly swerving in front of the vehicle should it finally stop. Remember it would be only natural to go for the brakes first to avoid hitting the car. But, if you realize you are running out of room, and you now decide to swerve, you must get completely get off the brakes before you initiate a swerve. The tires can't handle the traction stress of being loaded with maximum braking and adding a swerve at the same time. You must separate braking from swerving should you decide you need to swerve. If you don't separate braking from swerving the tires are likely to lose traction and you are going down. It's not a perfect world, so you must be as ready as possible.

Now you know what the stopping distance should be at 45mph which is 90 feet. Find a place out of traffic you can practice. Mark off where you will apply the brakes and mark 90 feet from there as to where you should be able to stop. Get moving and level off your speed at 45mph. Apply your brakes as hard as possible just short of skidding at the braking start point. See if you can come to a complete stop at or before the 90ft stop point. It is better to find out whether or not you can properly stop under controlled safe conditions rather than when the car turns left in front of you at an intersection.

Riding skills perish if you do not regularly practice.


